Students in S1 RMPS have, over the past 3 years been entered into a poster programme which has been inspired by the Olympics. The students have had to explore their character, ideal and values using web based resources as well as writing about an Olympic or Paralympic athlete that inspires them, an analysis of what they want to achieve in their life and a reflection on how they will achieve their goals.









This year we also entered half of the S1's in the new three year programme titled 'Inspire-Aspire, Global Citizens in the Making'.
